“Receiving a license to use the DVB MHP logo marks the transition of our MHP development focus from R&D to technical and commercial trials,” said Shozo Ohtani, president and chief executive officer, Zentek Technology Group. “With our successful development of products that support both MHP and the Globally Executable (GEM) standards already adopted in North America (OCAP) and



Japan (ARIB B-23), Zentek is poised to facilitate commercial implementations on a global basis as markets develop.”
